- Thanked Frank Schuurmans for his cooperation in this project
- Now have 5 MAVIC 2 Enterprise dual camera drones, of which one is infrared smart controller
- Range up to 10 km
- Benefit is you can launch over the forest vice tromp thru the forest and good for close to shore use
- Requested BVLOS (beyond visual line of sight) for short range of 2km they (Tpt Canada) want us to first fly for two years
- Long range implantation range is to deploy one to each zone –
- Want to use this drone to move around to the zones- to train users to the advanced level
- A larger drone is coming out called MAVIC 2 Enterprise Advanced 4 x better camera EI/OR (Electro-Optical/Infra-Red)
- Frank stated we are identifying who nationally has RPAS Basic and advanced –
 and shortly will be able to be entered/identified in TMMS and new drones
 are being purchased which will go out to those individuals. A lot of other
 units are looking at CASARA for this tech
- Darren Emery asked-how do multiple drones in one area talk/prevent running into each other. Frank replied that the drones are aware of aircraft with ADS-B out and will avoid them. Gord perceives the drone will do its search, then you land it and the planes then launch also mentioned the military will not let the drones launch if there are planes in the area Maj Courcelles stated they have a regulation no military flying in an airspace with a drone flying
- Mavic has add-on modules loud speaker and bright light can pre-record a message
- Gord Tessier has developed SOPS and will incorporate improvements
- Simon Cousineau said there will be a chapter in the CTOM
- Gord Tessier stated his will improve our value with JRCC
- Frank Schuurman stated they are registered aircraft currently with Frank Schuurmans, Marco Laforest, John Saunders, Gord Tessier and Fred Carey

- i. Liaise with the Zone Treasurer and/or Zone Commander at least monthly to ensure that training expenditures are reasonably aligned with the zone's training budget.
- j. Liaise with the MO/Provincial/Territorial Training Officer to ensure that the zone's training meets the needs of CASARA and that the training materials meet the needs of the zone's members.
- k. Carry out any other related duties as requested by the Zone Commander and/or the MO/Provincial/Territorial Training Officer.

A certified CASARA ASM member must comply with one of the following to keep his/her certification:
